Happy New Year to you all!

In 2018, we accomplished more than we believed we could, and in 2019 we are challenging ourselves to do even more. The Bernie Scholarship Awards Program gave its largest number of awards to 63 recipients, bringing our total awards to 524 for 474 scholars and the total dollars awarded to \$625,200. With your generous support, we help low-income determined individuals achieve academic and personal goals of upward mobility.

Our goal for 2019 is to award \$1,500 to each scholar, which requires raising \$97,500 to support 65 awardees. Our goal is to continue building a better community one scholarship at a time.



Maryland's New Community College Scholarship Program



The Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship Program becomes available to applicants in the 2019-2020 academic year. The Promise Scholarship creates opportunities for students to attend a Maryland's public community college by providing tuition assistance for students eligible for in-state tuition for a credit-bearing vocational certificate or an Associate Degree program. FOOD INSECURITY: College students from low-income backgrounds who are parents with young children, in the Federal Work Study Program, recipients of TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) and who work at least 20 hours a week are eligible for the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). Bernie Looks Back...

Bernard Tetreault, co-founder of The Bernie Scholarship Awards Program, reminisces: "When I left Montgomery County Housing Opportunities Commission (HOC) in 1994 after being its Executive Director for 24 years, \$33,000 was generated to start The Bernie Scholarship Awards Program. I grew up in a large, poor family, but my father believed in education and was chairman of the school board in our small town. He told me and my 8 siblings if we earned the grades to continue our education, he would somehow make funds available. This value of education was the seed for our scholarship program. Working for HOC, I was inspired by employees who, while working full-time, also pursued higher education. Also, an HOC day care worker told me that the graduation from day care to first grade might be the only graduation that some of those children ever had.

We now serve low-income residents of Housing Opportunities Commission, Rockville Housing Enterprises, Scotland Community, Edgewood Management Corporation, Forest Park Apartments and of other Montgomery County properties with housing subsidies.

The biggest change? The number of scholarships awarded continues to increase; what has not changed is the people we serve--they have little disposable income. Our scholars' stories about their struggles and successes inspire us to keep on helping. Our award funds may be used for transportation, a computer and child care as well as for tuition, books and fees.

Knowing that the people we serve are breaking the cycle of poverty is very rewarding to me, our donors and Board and Advisory Board members.

ONGOING VOLUNTEER NEEDS:

Board and Advisory Board members who have skills in public relations/marketing, business outreach, fundraising, social media, event planning, mentoring.

Volunteer Mentors/Coaches to help our awardees adapt to college or training programs.

Our mentors are more like coaches who check-in with their assigned students three times a year, for a minimum of one year, to ask how they're doing and provide encouragement, resources and advice to help them resolve academic or other problems and to not give up their educational goals. Some of our awardees are the first in their family to go to college and/or may be foreign born and need guidance on how our college system works. Training and guidelines for new mentors/coaches is provided by Board members.

Administrative volunteers to help our Program Administrator from time to time in any of the following areas:

March 1st marks the Deadline for the Bernie Scholarship Awards Program's online Application Form and required documents, but it also marks the start of Women's History Month.

Since 1972, Title IX has provided the right to education free from sex discrimination. With Title IX, women and girls have been able to make great strides toward sex equality in education, but many serious obstacles remain, such as single parenthood. U.S. Census data shows about 82.2% of custodial parents are mothers. For single parents who are supporting children, going to school can seem like an impossible dream. The Bernie Scholarship strives to make the dream possible.

Many of Bernie Scholarships' 474 recipients (524 awards) have been single mothers working toward upward mobility. One is Yvette Hammond, a single mother who, through multi-year Bernie scholarships, completed her B.S. degree and is now in a Master's program. She rose above her challenging circumstances, got a full-time job in Community Health and purchased a home. To all the strong, intelligent, and hard-working single mothers, if you are looking to go to school for college or vocational training, The Bernie Scholarship Awards Program is here for you.
