Inspirational stories were shared by two Bernie Scholarship awardees: Erika Granville, a full-time employed mother of three taking college courses in forensics studies, and Natanel Assefa, who founded his high school's Tech Team and is now in his first year of college studying computer science. The evening ended with announcing the auction winners and our upcoming annual Awards Celebration to be held on May 23rd. A great time was had by all.

2019 Scholarship Application Update



All scholarship applications were received by the March 1st deadline. The 85 applications were from very low-income residents of subsidized housing in Montgomery County. These applicants want to attend college or workforce development training but are unable to without more financial assistance in addition to federal FASFA/Pell grants.

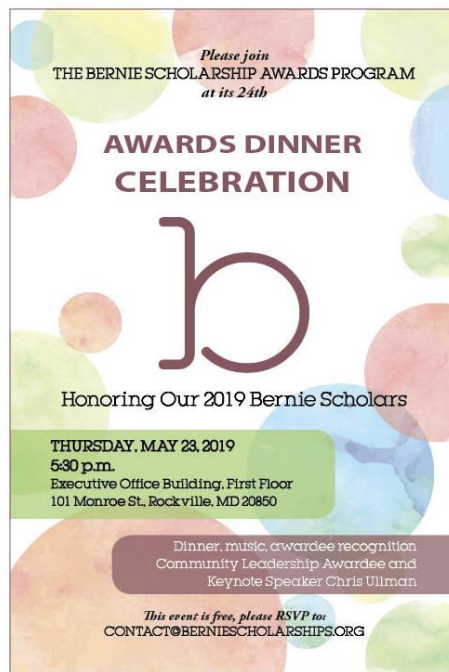
Applications are currently being reviewed, and all eligible candidates will be interviewed by Board members on May 4th, when the final selections will be made.

Provide financial assistance for college or training programs to graduating high school seniors and other adults who are very low-income and live in subsidized housing in Montgomery County, Maryland.

Our Goal

BERNIE SCHOLARSHIPS' 2018 Effectiveness Study Findings

Ninety-eight percent (98%) of awardees are still enrolled in school or have completed a degree or certificate program.

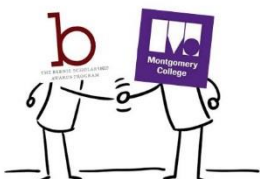
2018 was the third year of our Effectiveness Studies, and we had a 36% higher response rate. Our goal is to keep improving our response rate so that we can better track the progress of awardees toward education completion rates and increased standards of living. Twenty of the 57 respondents in 2018 were new awardees. Twenty-five respondents had received two or more Bernie Scholarship awards. Additionally, 23 of the 2018 respondents have applied for a 2019 Bernie Scholarship Award. We will also measure the effectiveness of multiple awards on education completion and standards of living. NEW PILOT PARTNERSHIP WITH MONTGOMERY COLLEGE AWARDEES



For the 2019-2020 academic year, we are referring our scholarship applicants who plan to attend Montgomery College (MC) to register at MC and apply for General Scholarship funds. For those who choose The Bernie Scholarship funds, we will provide our 2019 award fund amount to MC for each eligible Bernie Scholarship applicant approved by MC.

Harries, full-time employed mother of 3 in college full-time, both described the great need of very low-income residents of subsidized housing for The Bernie Program's gap financial help in order to attend college or workforce development training. Theresa grew up in a low-income area where she was the first in her family to attend college, which would not have been possible without financial assistance. Tonia said she had completed coding training with federal FAFSA funds and loans, but her school shut down, fortunately The Bernie awards enabled her to complete her A.A. degree in Health Information Management this May 2019.

Board and Advisory Board members or outside consultants who have any of these skills: Public relations, marketing, business outreach, fundraising, social media, event planning.

Mentors/Coaches to help our awardees adapt to college or workforce development training, how to seek help for their studies, find needed resources, etc. Our mentors are more like coaches who check-in with their student awardees about 3 times a year for a minimum of a year, ask how they're doing, provide encouragement, resources and advice to help them resolve academic or other challenges and to not give up their educational goals. Some of our awardees are the first in their family to go to college and/or may be foreign born and need guidance on how American college systems work. Training, guidelines and follow-up assistance for new mentors/coaches is provided.
